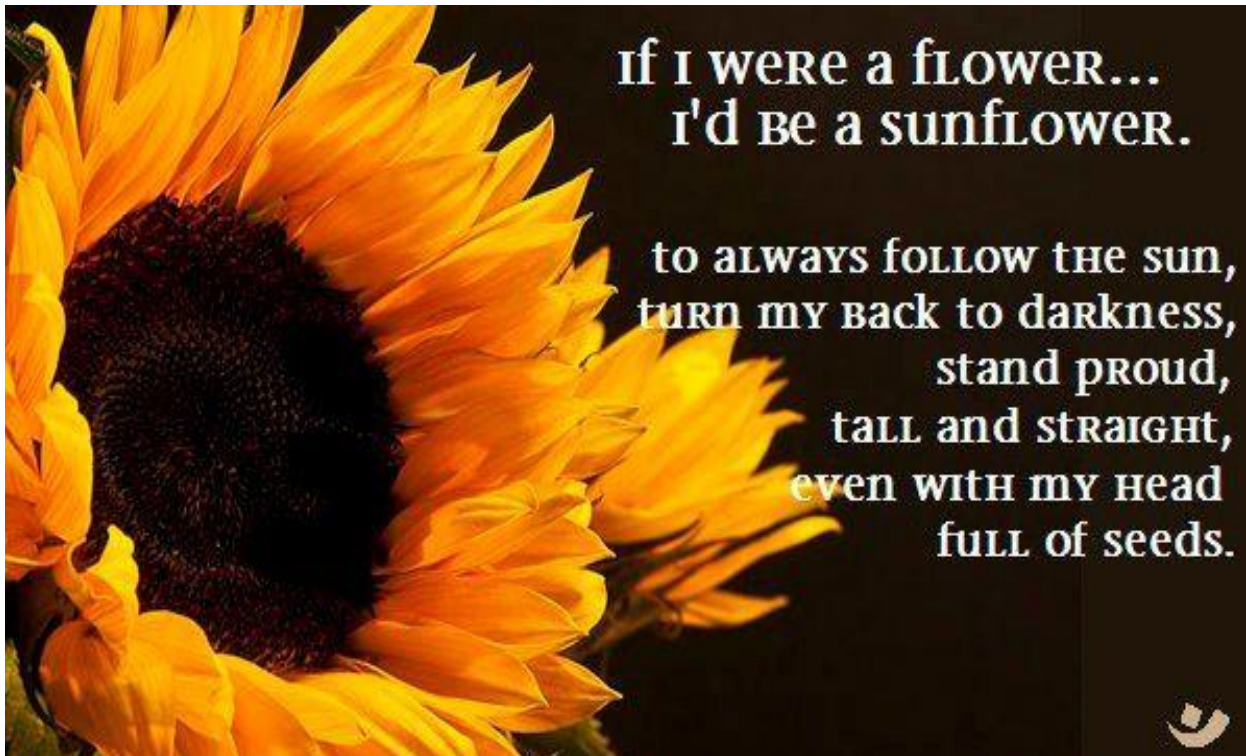

## Theology of Emergency Chaplaincy Part 2

The Lutheran Chaplain has the unique ability to bring to light not only the comfort but the root cause of the pain and suffering in the world. The Lutheran Chaplain will not hide the truth from those he seeks to help but will boldly reveal the truth in love and gentleness to all. Only when the root, sin, has been revealed can the comfort of the victory of Jesus on the cross come to comfort all those who are suffering. The Christus Victor theme of atonement becomes predominant in the work of the chaplain. Christus Victor becomes the hope of both the one experiencing the emergency and the first responder. While the whole of doctrine is not to be ignored in these times the victory of Christ over a sin broken world becomes somewhat of a mantra of the Lutheran Chaplain. Always pointing people away from their own failed attempts at victory over sin and back to the Victor who was not and shall not be defeated.

The Lutheran Chaplain extends the mission of the church by reaching out to these hurting souls with the care of souls. During this time the Lutheran Chaplain will not be actively proselytizing but will bring the only goods he has for comforting these hurting souls—the blood of Christ. In this way, the mission of proclaiming Christ crucified for the forgiveness of sins to the world will be extended within the work of the Lutheran Chaplain. This can be summed up well by the Collect of the Day for Proper 7 Series A: “O God, because Your abiding presence always goes with us, keep us aware of Your daily mercies that we may lie secure and content in Your eternal love; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.” We pray that God would always remind us of His abiding presence and how fitting to the work of the Chaplain. The one who in the middle of the disaster becomes the outward visible presence of God in chaos.

Finally, the tools the Lutheran Chaplain brings with him is a set made up at the center with the Word of God and prayer. Surrounding this can be the liturgy, hymnals, devotions, the Pastoral Care Companion, the Visitation Book (from CPH), and the depth of the Chaplain’s knowledge of the scripture. Bringing these tools with the understanding there is no blanket answer, no one size fits all prayer or devotion equips the Lutheran Chaplain to bring comfort and pastoral care to the hurting and suffering of the world. There are two final tools that the Chaplain has which every Chaplain is equipped with. The first is two ears. These ears are made to listen to the story, the suffering, the anguish, the questions, the demands of those he is called to minister too. The second is questions. Often the most powerful form of communication the Chaplain has is not to provide answers but to ask questions which lead the conversation, the person, toward the right understanding in light of God’s Word.

The chaplain's works are hard work. Work in the heat of suffering in the middle of the battle of sin and the devil for the lives and souls of God’s people. Here stands the Chaplain. Not by himself or for himself, but with the steadfast presence of God. The Chaplain can hear the suffering of the people and speak as Jesus spoke peace. Not a worldly peace, promising of things going perfectly here and now, but of an eternal peace which comes from Jesus Christ winning victory on the cross over a sin broken world. It is the chaplain who assures the firefighter, EMT, Officer, victim God has not forgotten them, abandoned them, or hated them. On the contrary, God loved them so much He sent His only Son to die for them so that they might believe and have eternal life, have the assurance of peace in this chaos.

Our Lord’s life is defined in this way. He gave completely of Himself for us. He became man for us. He taught the truth of God’s Word. He healed those with many and various diseases. Because when we give, we join in the bond of friendship and family, the bond of service to those around us out of love for them. And love is the fulfillment of the Law. It is the nature of God Himself, for God is Love. Thus, we are participating in the divine nature. As Jesus said, “It is more blessed to give than to receive” (Acts 20:35).

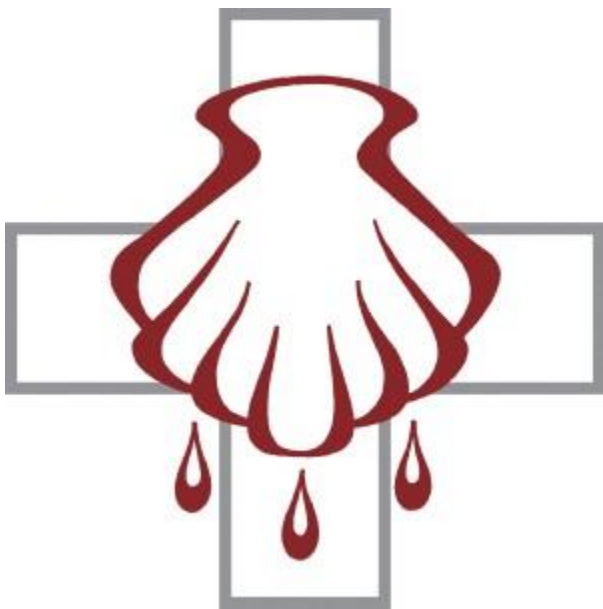

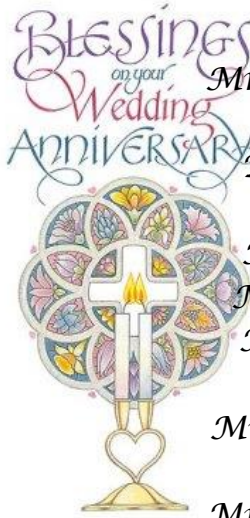
