

Sing Thanksgivings to the Lord

"Let them thank the LORD for his steadfast love, for his wondrous works to the children of man! And let them offer sacrifices of thanksgiving, and tell of his deeds in songs of joy!" (Ps. 107:21-22).

Thanksgiving is coming this month. It might look different from past years because of COVID but it will still come. There are lots of things which could be different this year but the theme of being thankful will still be here. The world recognizes the need to be thankful for the things we have: family, homes, cars, jobs, health, and etc. The world knows most of the time we take these things for granted and need to be reminded to slow down and think about them. To help with this the world has created a holiday called Thanksgiving. A time when people get together to remember and think about all that they have.

While it is great to have a day assigned to being thankful for what we have it does nothing to tell us how we have everything to be thankful for. The world wants us to see ourselves or other people as the source for everything we have but if we are honest we know there is another source from where all we have has come. The Psalmist points us to the true source and reason that we have all that we have. We are to see the Lord God, as the source for all that we are given in our lives. We are to understand God gives these things to us not because we deserve them or have earned them but out of His steadfast love for us. This is part of God's gracious work of saving His people, making sure that we have everything for this body and life.

The tone for Thanksgiving in America is a good start to the Christian's being thankful for what the Lord provides. We slow down, look around seeing all that we have as a gift from God, and then returning thanks and praise to God for His continued care for us. We do not give thanks to the Lord by just having one day where we eat a big meal together and talk about the things we are thankful for. The Psalm tells us of ways we can be thankful to the Lord.

We can always give thanks in prayer, but the Psalmist also lists singing songs of joy or thanksgiving to God for what He has given to us. These do not need to be complicated and some can be found in our hymn on pages 892-895. "Now Thank We All Our God" (LSB 895) is short sweet and to the point. Hear stanza 1, "Now thank we all our God With hearts and hands and voices," it begins with this call to thankfulness with all of our being. "Who wondrous things had one, In whom His world rejoices; Who from our mothers' arms has blest us on our way With countless gifts of love And still is ours today." And brings us to see that we are thankful because God has been the one to bless us from the time of our birth and helps us to see the ongoing care of God as God is still our God to this day. With this one stanza, we give thanks to God as the source of all the good things we have in life. No extravagant list necessary, simply summing it up for us to see.

This Thanksgiving will be different. COVID will change the way many gather and celebrate. Let it not stop your celebration and giving thanks to the Lord. Pray to Him, give to Him, and sing to Him. Maybe even sing this hymn of thanksgiving to God this year. For nothing stops God from providing for His people because of His love for us.

Terry Reck introduced discussion on creating an Endowment / foundation fund as an account to use for unforeseen expenses that may arise. This would be an account for donations to be stored.

Motion by Dave Beeck, 2nd by Terry Reck to increase Pastor Welton's salary to \$45,000.00 and designate 50% as housing allowance. An additional \$12,000 as housing allowance. Contribute \$2,500.00 to a Health Savings Account, and 5.6% Social Security offset.

Motion by Gale Maas, 2nd by Terry Reck to accept Chuck Eppe as a voting member. Motion Carries. Chuck signed the "Approved Voters List".

Motion by Jerry Gehrels, 2nd by Gale Maas to increase the Secretary's Salary by 3% (\$540.00 / 2 weeks). Motion Carries.

Motion by Gale Maas, 2nd by Jason Fischer to leave the Janitor's Salary as is. Motion Carries.

Motion by Loren Lindholm 2nd by Terry Reck to leave Organist's salary as is. Motion Carries.

Election of officers:

Motion by Terry Reck, 2nd by Gale Maas to delay vote on filling the vacant Elder office. Motion Carries.

Call for nominations for Secretary. Motion by Terry Reck, 2nd by Jeff Arneson for nominations to cease. Dan Alfson elected by unanimous ballot.

Call for nominations for Treasurer. Motion by Jeff Arneson, 2nd by Terry Reck for nominations to cease. Dave Beeck elected by unanimous ballot.

<u>Board of Education:</u> Nominations - Kasey Gehrels, Scott Feige, Kory Reck. Scott Feige elected by paper ballot.

<u>Board of Stewardship:</u> Nominations - Jon Gehrels, Kory Reck. Jon Gehrels elected by paper ballot.

<u>Board of Trustees</u>: Nominations - Jesse Baumberger, Jerry Gehrels. Dave Beeck move nominations cease, 2nd by Mark Limmer. Jerry Gehrels elected by paper ballot.

Kory Reck inquired if any research was put into the addition of cameras to record services. Pastor Welton stated rough estimates were \$12,000 to \$16,000.

Terry Reck brought up that estimates for professional cleaning of all carpet floors were quite high and really only the fellowship hall needed it.

Motion by Jeff Arneson, 2nd by Jason Fischer to have the fellowship hall and the Narthex professionally cleaned at an estimated cost not to exceed \$1,800.00. Motion Carries.

Pastor Welton introduced discussion that the Confirmation requirement of attending a camp was too restrictive in some cases.

Motion by Chuck Eppe, 2nd by Gale Maas to remove the requirement of attending a camp before being confirmed. Motion Carries. It is still highly recommended confirmands attend Camp Komeka.


