#### The Over Grown Jungle of Podcasts

Podcasting, Livestreaming, blogging, vlogging, and the terms go on. Some might be familiar with these terms and for some, they might be a foreign language, but they are a reality of the world we live in. Anyone can start one. Just do an internet search for LCMS Lutheran Podcasts and over 70 podcasts will come up (and none of them have I ever heard of). Navigating a world filled with thousands and thousands of Christian podcasts will drown a person. No one has time to listen to every one of them to find out which ones are good and which ones are bad. This month I want to help you dig through all the podcasts out there and start to narrow them down to some you could listen to.

What makes a good podcast? Before we can get into depth on podcasts or blogs, or vlogs we need to first consider the source. Before ever listening or reading click on the about section and read it completely. Look for some key items which are going to help you know if this podcast is going to be worth listening to. First, make sure it comes from someone or an organization that has connections with the LCMS. If they have anything stating what they believe read over it and see if it lines up with what we believe, teach, and confess. Lastly, if all of that looks good go ahead and listen to the podcast, read the blog, or watch it.

What to do while you are listening. First, have a Bible present and check to look up all scripture passages quoted. The reason is to make sure they are quoted correctly and so you know them. Sometimes we think we know what a passage says and we have forgotten or mixed it up with a different passage. Second, compare this to what you have learned in confirmation, sermons, and bible studies. Third, trust your Lutheran Spidey senses. If something seems strange or off it probably is off. If there is a lot of stuff that seems off about it and you cannot put your finger on why it seems off stop listening.

What if you liked the podcast but there were things off about it? Ask your pastor. He is the resident theologian there at your fingertips to read, listen and watch anything theological and help you understand it. He has the training and the experience to tell why what you are listening to is off. It might be as simple as they are saying it in a way you have never heard it or it could be they are completely wrong and teaching falsely. The resident theologian will be able to help you determine which of these the podcast falls into.

Why listen to podcasts or read blogs or watch vlogs? Short answer: they are another way for us to learn the Word of God. They can be wonderful gifts from God to keep us connected to His Word even when we are not in church and help us prepare for the coming Sunday as we have contemplated the Word of God all week in preparation for receiving the Lord's Supper. Also, there are many podcasts that can grow our knowledge of God's Word and help us feel comfortable in Bible Studies and when we are asked questions by friends and family.

Where to listen to podcasts, read blogs, and watch vlogs? There are hundreds of apps and sites out there which allow you to stream podcasts and vlogs and even download blogs right to your phone or computer. I use one called Overcast but it is just one. Pick the one you like the best and use it. These apps when used on your phone allow you to listen anywhere you are: at home, in the car, in the tractor, on the plane, at the mall, at the dentist, etc. giving you the ability to continue to learn the word of God continuously.

Suggestions of podcasts to listen to Thinking Fellows, Issues Etc., Lutheran Hour Ministry (they have one for their sermons and one for their daily devotions), The Lutheran Witness has a podcast. The list could go on and on. If you listened to any of these podcasts you would be in good shape. If you have a podcast or blog you are currently listening to please feel free to share with me I would love to learn of a new solid Lutheran podcast.

### Newsletter Article - May 2021

St. Paul teaches us: "Let the one who is taught the word share all good things with the one who teaches" (Gal. 6:6). And again, he says: "Do you not know that those who are employed in the temple service get their food from the temple, and those who serve at the altar share in the sacrificial offerings? In the same way, the Lord commanded that those who proclaim the gospel should get their living by the gospel" (1 Cor. 9:13–14). In other words, ministers of the Gospel are supported by the offerings of those who are served by them.

And this is how the church lives even now. It is standard practice. But this deserves closer examination. For it instructs us not just *that* we are to give but also *what* we are to give. And it does so with four little words: "In the same way ..."

St. Paul is building his case for supporting the preachers of the Gospel with the sacrificial giving of individual members on the example of the Old Testament people who supported the Levites with their offerings and sacrifices. We're to support the Gospel ministry "in the same way." But how did the Old Testament people support the Levites?

Moses records this: "You shall tithe all the yield of your seed that comes from the field year by year. And before the Lord your God, in the place that he will choose, to make his name dwell there, you shall eat the tithe of your grain, of your wine, and of your oil, and the firstborn of your herd and flock, that you may learn to fear the Lord your God always" (Deut. 14:22–23). The Levites were supported by the tithe, 10 percent of all the yearly yield of that which was harvested.

Does that seem like a lot? Does it surprise you that St. Paul instructs us that we are to support the New Testament Gospel ministry "in the same way?" If it does, ask yourself: Is the church's job in the New Testament bigger or smaller than the Levites' job in the Old Testament? Back then, there was one Temple, and the ministry was almost exclusively located in one nation among the descendants of Abraham. In Matthew 28, Jesus calls us to teach and baptize all nations, and there are churches and ministries all around the world! How could we support this new Gospel ministry with anything less than the Israelites supported the Old Testament ministry?

Of course, we are free to give more, for we have received more than those in the Old Testament. We have received the fullness of God's revelation, the fullness of His salvation, and the fulfillment of everything that God promised to do. For we have received Christ, God's own Son, in the flesh, who took upon himself our sins and in exchange gave us his righteousness. The Father claimed us as his own in Holy Baptism. He gathers us together in the place where his name dwells to feast on the first fruits of the resurrection, the risen and living body and blood of His Son – our Lord Jesus. He reminds us that we are His, that all things are ours because we belong to Him. He blesses us here in time with physical and spiritual gifts.

In the same way – and in response to His fatherly divine goodness and mercy – we gladly give to those who proclaim to us "the excellencies of him who called us out of darkness and into his marvelous light." For once we were not a people, but now we are God's people; once we had not received mercy, but now we have indeed (1 Peter 2:9–10).
