Weekly Communion: Questions To Start With

By now you have heard the Elders and Pastors have been studying the topic of weekly communion. If you have not now you know. A little history on this within St. Peter's will be helpful. St. Peter's has been having communion on the first, third, and fifth Sunday for over a decade. In 2018 at the April voter's meeting there was a motion that was passed by the voters of the congregation calling for the study of weekly communion. This begins a study by the Pastor on the topic and finally a study by the Pastor and Elders together over the course of this year.

There is too much to go over to cover everything in a simple newsletter article. But as people begin to think about this topic, we want to assure you we are going to be teaching on Weekly Communion with the whole congregation. That is going to be happening later this year. For now, we want to start by priming the pump to say with some questions. It can be hard to know what to even start thinking about let alone what questions to ask on a topic like Weekly Communion. Hopefully, these questions will help.

Any time we are changing what we do in church we should start with one basic question: What does God's Word have to say? We start by looking to see if the Word of God has anything to say about it. Second, if it is commanded or forbidden. Lastly, if it is commanded or we are allowed to do it does God's Word give us any directions on what to do or how to do it. One phrase we need to spend some time on is commanded or forbidden. We need to understand that there are three categories' things fall into in the church. One, the category of command meaning God's Word tells us we must be doing this. Like baptism where Jesus tells us "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations baptizing them..." (Mt. 38:19). Second, the category of forbidden meaning things the Word of God stops us from doing. An example of this is the putting of statues in the church of great saints from church history and praying to them. Third, the category is neither commanded nor forbidden. Meaning God's Word is silent on the issue and we are free to do as we would like keeping in mind the honor, respect, and worship of God.

The second question is what has the church historically done? This question starts with what has your local congregation done in its history but recognizes no congregation is an island unto itself. After asking what the congregation has done it moves out to the wider church. There you ask what has the church done through its over 2,000 years of history. This can be done by looking at the writings of the early church and the confessional writings of past theologians. The purpose is not to supersede what the Word of God has to say but to see how the church historically understood what the Word of God has had to say about a topic.

The third question and fourth question go hand in hand. First, if the practice is different from what the church did historically why did it change? What caused the church to alter in the case of communion the frequency? The answer to this question will help lead us to the answer to the fourth and final question. Why should we change the practice? Here is the question we have been driving at this whole time. Why would we change our practice? Is there a good reason too? Is there any reason at all or only reasons not to?

My prayer is as you are starting to think about communion frequency and specifically weekly communion you will let these questions start to shape your thinking. Also, know we need to answer these questions before we can form any lasting opinions or practices on the topic. With that in mind, we will (as mentioned above) be studying this together as a congregation and seeing what the answer to these four questions might be. Blessings and God's guidance as you either start to or continue to think and pray about weekly communion.

He calls us to live in faith toward Him and in fervent love for our neighbor. He calls us to put the gifts He gives to us in His service. God calls parents provide for their children and raise them in the fear and admonition of the Lord.

And God calls children to honor their parents and provide and care for them when they are no longer able to do so themselves.
