Credo: Protection from Harm and Danger

"My help comes from the LORD, the Make of heaven and earth. ... The LORD will keep you from all harm – he will watch over your life" (Ps. 121:2, 7). The King James Version clears this passage up "The LORD will preserve thee from all evil: he shall preserve they soul" (Ps. 121:7). No matter if you go with the ESV or KJV what we hear is God the Father is working to protecting us from harm and danger.

The harm and danger come in two different ways. First, in the physical life when either we are directly attacked by people and other things in this life and by disease. Second, is in our spiritual life where the Tempter attacks us trying to kill us eternally. We could spend time talking about how these attacks take come to us but here we want to talk about the work of God.

This work of God for your protection comes through all of creation: angels, parents, government, doctors, nurses, and etc. God uses these ordinary means to protect you from physical harm. Whether that harm be from other people or illnesses. What this means is we need to see these people as the hands and feet of God in their vocations. It means we also see their work not simply as earthly work but divine work. Work done by God through them for your good.

I will give you it is mundane. It is simple and straight forward. Nothing really exciting about it. These are the things which can be difficult to believe. As we start to look to them we see God doing what He has promised to do protect us from all harm and danger.

But Pastor bad things still happen? The question of why God allows these bad things to happen denies what we have been talking about. God does not allow bad things to happen He protects you from them and puts limits on them. We see that when the cops stop people from continuing to harm people. Or the military stops other countries from harming us. Or a doctor heals

a broken bone or stops a disease process which would have continued to do us harm.

We have to remember we live in a world with sin in it and broken by sin. People who should protect us fail at times to carryout their vocations properly. Or in sin our bodies are not able to be repaired by doctors. Remember, God did not tell us in this life suffering and death would not come to us but promised those things would continue to happen because of sins. This leads us to the ultimate protection from eternal death and punishment. God the Father protects us from dying eternally. This is done by sending Jesus Christ, His son our Lord, into the world to be conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary.

Jesus is going to die on the cross to protect us from this ultimate harm of eternal death. He is raised so we can be raised from death and given new life in heaven where there will be no evil or harm that can befall us. This is the final and everlasting protection we receive from God our Heavenly Father.

Jesus Christ, the Son, will be the topic for our next newsletter article. For now we remember God the Father protects us from all harm and danger, from all evil especially the work of our evil foe the devil.

He followed her to school each day, 'Twasn't even in the rule. He made the children laugh and play. To have a Lamb at school.


And then the rules all changed one day, Illegal it became; To bring the Lamb of God to school, Or even speak His name.
