Credo: The Work of The Holy Spirit

As we come to the Third Article of the Creed we come to the portion which is often glanced over due to the time spent on the Second Article and the Person of Christ. I confess that I am guilty of this in my own teaching. It is for a good reason but I would like to offer a corrective here in this article, as poor as it might be.

The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Trinity. We confess the Holy Spirit to be uncreated, and not begotten but preceding or sent by the Father and the Son, by whom the prophets and Apostle's spoke. The Holy Spirit is equal in majesty, eternity, and infinity. This makes Holy Spirit one God with the Father and the Son.

While the Holy Spirit in one with the Father and the Son, and shares in all the work of the God head we normally set aside what scripture tells us is the specific work of the Holy Spirit: Inspiration of the Holy Scriptures and Creating Faith in the hearts of all believers.

The first work of the Holy Spirit is that of inspiration of the Scriptures. We see the prophets of old (meaning the Old Testament) and the Apostles as having written under inspiration of God so that all of Scriptures is the Word of God, inspired and inerrant, but this was accomplished by the Holy Spirit. We do not know the details of how the Holy Spirit inspired the writers of the Scriptures but we know all was written down was given by God for the salvation of the world and therefore "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness,

# make known among the nations what he has done."

that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work" (2 Tim. 3:16-17).

In understanding this as the work of the Holy Spirit we learn an important fact about the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit speaks of only what is important to God, and that is the plan and work of the salvation. To put it in scriptural terms it means the Holy Spirit bears witness about Christ and His Work of Salvation. The practical application in Scriptures of this means there is little about the Holy Spirit Himself written in the scriptures.

The second work of the Holy Spirit is the work of faith. He accomplishes this work by using the Means of Grace to create faith in the hearts of all believers and then strengthening that faith. The Means of Grace is a quick reference to the Word of God and the Sacraments (Baptism, Absolution, and Lord's Supper) which the Holy Spirit uses to create faith.

The Holy Spirit accomplishes this work primarily through the church. We will talk more next month on the church, but for this month we need to see that the Holy Spirit gathers all believers into the church. There He works the hearing of God's Word that many would come to faith. The church is the place God has given to speak His Word to the world and therefore becomes the place the Holy Spirit primarily accomplishes His work.

We see the close connection to the church which we will hear more about next month.

Dear Brother in Christ,


