Christ has called all Christians to show love to their neighbors. "Jesus answered, "The most important is, 'Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these" (Mark 12:29-31). The summary of all the law can be said simply Love God and love your neighbor. Saying it and doing it are two completely different things. How do you love your neighbor?

To answer this question, we have to understand our love flows from God's love for us. We can love our neighbors because God first loved us and gave us His love in the flesh and blood death of His Son, Jesus Christ. You have received this love in the waters of your baptism, in the words of absolution, and in the Body and Blood of the Lord's Supper. Wonderfully, the love of God never runs thin or runs out. It is always overflowing for you with forgiveness in mercy and grace.

Out of God's love for you flows the love for your neighbor. To answer how we can love our neighbor in great detail would exceed the limits of what we have room for here. But a couple of examples will demonstrate for us and my prayer would be to get the wheels turning for you to find many and various ways to love your neighbor. We can first do works of mercy. These works can be many but one way would be to become certified in Lutheran Early Response Team (LERT) training and help out in disaster situations. These disasters can be small or large. Sometimes they will cover just one home or they might be covering vast cities and areas of the country. By coming and helping to clean up and recover from this disaster you show love to your neighbor by being the hands and feet of God's mercy to them in this tragic time.

Showing love can be as simple as providing a meal to a family who is having a difficult time. Maybe Mom is sick and Dad is working so you can help by cooking for them. Maybe a joyous event of a new baby has come onto this family, and it would be a blessing for the new mom and dad not to have to cook meals or even just to have a couple of meals on hand for those times when they have been up all night and are exhausted. Here again, you become the hands and feet of God's mercy to these people.

The greatest love we can show is the love found in the gospel. When we bring the Word of God to people who have never heard it or even people who have but need it again, we show them, love. A love that desires for them to have the greatest gift of all the peace and hope only found in the death and resurrection of Christ. Here we become the voice of God bringing His grace and mercy to all those around us.

Whether it is LERT training, meal train, or some other work we always couple it with the hope in Christ for eternal life. What can you do to show love to your neighbor and be the hands and feet of God's mercy in this world?

Please join us in the Fellowship Hall following service.






Every year on the first Sunday in June we recognize members starting from May to the following May when our Seniors graduate high school.
