

Lutheran Hymns of the Church Year

Jesus, Once with Sinners Numbered (LSB 404)

This year we are going to be looking at twelve different hymns throughout the year. The goal will be to see the wonderful proclamation of Law and Gospel in our hymns and to understand our hymnody a little better and come to enjoy the

richness of it.

I will be writing a brief introduction on our hymns as they are printed in the LSB and looking at our first hymn. After that we are blessed to be having several guest writers throughout the year. I will give a brief introduction to each one when they write so you know who they are and where they are from.

When we look at our hymns in the LSB there is a plethora of information on each page. At the top of each page, you will find three things: Title of the Hymn, Hymn Number, and the Topical Suggestion for the Hymn. The hymn number needs no explanation. The Title of the hymn is normally the first line of the hymn but there is a number of hymns were this is not true i.e. On Eagles' Wings LSB 727 where the first line of the hymn is "You who dwell I the shelter of the Lord."

The suggested topic of the hymn is the opinion of the hymnal committee of how the hymn might be used best by the church. Some hymns fit well with a certain time in the church year, and others are good for giving thanks for God's blessings, and some bring us hope and comfort in times of spiritual distress.

At the bottom of the page in small type we have five additional pieces of information about the hymn. We have the text, tune, name of the tune, meter, and scripture the hymn is based on. The text tells us who the composer of the text of the hymn. You will have a birth and death date for the composer and if the hymn was translated into English, you will have the name of the translator.

The tune tells you the composer of the tune, if there is an alternate tune the composer of the alternate tune, and sometimes if it was taken from a specific place where it was taken from. An example is some hymn tunes come out of the old The Lutheran Hymnal (TLH).

The name of the tune can be found across the pages a good example is LSB 404 Jesus, Once with Sinners Numbered tune name is "Mississippi." Some hymns will share tunes with other hymns, and you can find these hymns by the name of the tune in the index for hymn tunes.

Under the name of the tune is the meter of the hymn. How many syllables will be found in each line of the hymn. There is some common hymn meters like long meter (88 88) and short meter (66 86), because of the frequency of the use of these meters they have been given their own name.

Finally, you will find in very small print a list of Scripture passages the hymn was based off. Large portions of the hymn might come out of these text or just small section or even just some of the words. No matter the amount of the Biblical text used in the hymn the themes found in the hymn will derive from these texts listed. If you want to know more about the hymn read these texts and see what the hymn writer had in mind as he wrote these beautiful words.

Scripture: Is 53:12; Matt 3:13-17; John 1:29, 36; Gal. 4:4-5

In stanza one we learn Jesus has no sin to begin with and enters the waters to accomplish His work of salvation for the whole world. We also, learn this Jesus is the one whom God sent into the world, His own Son, as is testified to by the opening of the heavens and the descending of the dove (the Holy Spirit) upon Jesus. This stanza sets the tone for the rest of the hymn as being baptismal as it continues to talk about Jesus' baptism and also our righteousness as we will see in stanza four.

Stanza two we learn from John the Baptist Jesus is the sinless Lamb of God who comes with good news for all the world. We are hearing echoes of Isaiah 53:12, "because he poured out his soul to death and was numbered with the transgressors; yet he bore the sin of many and makes intercession for the transgressors." We hear the news Jesus comes to proclaim to all the whole world the good news of salvation and it will come from the cross from which is preached the mercy of God's forgiveness for all people.

Stanza two also points us to the purpose of all preaching and preachers. They come with beautiful feet to proclaim mercy which is found on the cross in the salvation which Christ has won there by His death and resurrection. Also, if for some reason you did not hear this sweet news in the sermon you have now heard it in the hymn.

Stanza three teaches us the purpose for Jesus coming into the world. Jesus came into the world not to condemn sinners but to redeem the whole world from sin. The mission of Jesus goes out to the whole world, and should be proclaimed to the whole world because all can benefit from His wonderful work there on the cross

Stanza four tells us Jesus came to enter the waters of the Jordan to sanctify all waters for the use in Holy Baptism so in this washing in the blood of Christ the whole world would come to know of the love of God for the world. The lengthens God would go to save the world. And continue to tell us in our sin we are put to death with Jesus into baptism and raised to new life. Finally, it concludes by telling us we are under the cross and each day as we trace the cross upon us we are reminded of the mercy we have received in the waters of our baptism.

Stanza four teaches us why we make the sign of the cross. It is to remind us daily of the gifts God has given to us in baptism, and each day we need to drown the Old Adam in the waters of Baptism and rise to new life before God.

Jesus, Once with Sinners Numbered is an Epiphany hymn not only revealing the true identity of Jesus as the Son of God but also the work Christ came to do of redeeming us from our sins and then how God gives that redemption, salvation to us in the waters of our own baptism.


Date: June 2-7, 2024

We will travel by luxury motorcoach leaving Sioux Falls on Sunday at 1pm to our first stop, **Concordia University Wisconsin.** The group will stay in the dorms on campus at CUW. On Monday morning, the group will start the day with devotions, tour CUW and visit the shores of Lake Michigan!

We will depart CUW and travel to **Concordia Theological Seminary Fort Wayne.** We will stay on campus at CSTFW Monday evening. We will tour campus and attend Chapel services on Tuesday morning. After Chapel we will depart for Potter's Ranch in Union, Kentucky.

Upon arrival at **Potter's Ranch**, the group may participate in activities such as ziplining and paintball. The group will stay in the Pioneer Cabins at Potter's Ranch Tuesday and Wednesday evenings.

On Wednesday we will visit the **Creation Museum.** We will return to Potter's Ranch for supper and activities such as hiking trails, bouncy inflatables, 9 square, and a campfire.

Thursday morning we will depart Potter's Ranch and spend the day visiting the **Ark Encounter.** We will travel Thursday evening to St. Louis where we will stay at **Concordia Seminary St. Louis** or in a hotel nearby. Friday morning we will tour campus and attend Chapel services before traveling home to Sioux Falls. We anticipate arrival in Sioux Falls around 10pm.

The trip is intended for youth who have completed 7th grade through those who completed 12th grade in 2024. Chaperones at a ratio of 5:1.

With the exception of 5 meals, all costs (transportation, lodging, meals, entrance fees) are included in the trip price of \$850/person.

Youth from Mount Calvary Lutheran Church (Brookings, SD) have until January 28, 2024 to sign up and then registration will be open to others. At this time, individuals from outside Mount Calvary may sign up on a waiting list. Registration will then be confirmed after January 31, 2024. A \$250 de-posit to secure the spot is due by February 28, 2024. The balance is due by April 14, 2024.

Partial reimbursement from the SD District LCMS may be available upon submission of receipts to Chad Zinnel at the district office.


